## **Maximum Vehicle Widths and Lengths**

I have copied and simplified these tables from 'The Companion to British Road Haulage History' by various transport luminaries. I have tried to make sense of the headings for maximum vehicle widths but without much success as these definitions go back to 1861 and I cannot find any publication, even the DVLA website, that gives a reasonable explanation of the titles used. The vehicle length table has far simpler headings which all of us will be able to understand.
